# April 29, 2018 Fifth Sunday of Easter



## From the Pastor's Desk



*“Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own, unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me.”*  
(Jn 15:4).

Thankfully, the large piles of snow are finally melting! With this moisture and warmer weather we will soon begin to see buds on the trees and flowers coming up from the ground. Spring is one of my favorite times of the year. There is new life springing up everywhere around us. Each year I travel with my brother and nephews to Southeastern Minnesota to go turkey hunting, trout fishing, and more mushroom hunting. I enjoy harvesting these springtime fruits of the earth. In light of this, I will be on vacation this coming week.

Have you ever thought about how simple things like water and sunlight can bring about such beauty in creation? Water and sunlight have been the same since the beginning of time and are the same everywhere around the world but they are needed to bring about new life. Despite being the same, they produce an amazing variety of plants, trees and flowers, as well as supporting the lives of a vast multitude of animals.

In a similar way, God is the same everywhere and for all eternity, but He produces spiritual life and a variety of spiritual fruits in people.

God uses water to give us new life and spiritual gifts in baptism. He uses the fire of the Holy Spirit to awaken this life and open these gifts in Confirmation. I once read that the great Sequoia (Redwood) trees need fire to open

and regenerate their seeds. He also uses Holy Communion to continue the flow of grace within us. A similar thing has been happening in a spiritual way in our parish. Our 8th graders received Confirmation on Tuesday and our 2nd graders received their First Holy Communion on Saturday. Congratulations and may God begin to produce beautiful spiritual fruits in each of you in a glorious Springtime in the Church!

Jesus said that we must remain in him if we want to bear fruit. One of the most obvious ways that we remain in Him, and He in us, is the Eucharist. As we receive Communion we are like the branch that is connected to the vine and produces fruit. However, if we don't come to Mass and receive Holy Communion, we are like a tree or plant that has cut itself off from the flow of water that nourishes it. It does not produce lasting spiritual fruit and it will eventually wither and die.

That's why we stress that Confirmation is NOT graduation from our faith. It is just the beginning of an exciting adventure as a missionary of Christ! It's also why we stress that First Communion is not the last Communion or an every once in a while event. Jesus stresses that we need to remain in Him because it is a matter of spiritual life or death. Regular reception of Holy Communion is needed to maintain this flow of grace in our life, which keeps us spiritually alive. Jesus said, "Whoever eats my Flesh and Drinks My Blood will live forever and I will raise Him up on the last day." (Jn. 6).
