JUNE 24, 2018 NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST



From the Pastor's Desk

Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist

This year the Solemnity of the Nativity of John the Baptist is celebrated in the place of the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time. This is an ancient feast that goes back to the fourth century.

Why June 24? Although the Church doesn't know for sure when he was born, it is based on the tradition that Jesus was born on December 25. If we subtract 9 months from this date, we arrive at March 25, the day we celebrate the Annunciation and the conception of Jesus. It is also when the Archangel Gabriel told Mary that her cousin Elizabeth had been pregnant for six months. Three months later, June 24, Elizabeth would have given birth to John. While we are not sure about any of these dates, they are meant to show us the interconnectedness of the mysteries.

Another interesting thing to point out in regard to these dates is what the sun is doing. Near John's birth is the summer solstice, when the days start becoming shorter. Around Jesus' birth, the days start to get longer. This is interesting because when John was preaching in the desert, he said, "He must increase but I must decrease," (Jn 3:30). Jesus is the Son of God Whose coming has brought light to the world.

Speaking of John the Baptist, Jesus said, "He was a burning and shining lamp, and for a while you were

content to rejoice in his light. But I have testimony greater than John's. The works that the Father gave me to accomplish, these works that I perform testify on my behalf that the Father has sent me." (Jn 5: 35-36).

John the Baptist's whole life was to point people to Jesus so that they may rejoice in His eternal light. This should be the purpose of our lives as well.

Extreme Faith Camp

Some of our middle school children are at Extreme Faith Camp this week. This is the first year that we are sending kids to this camp. It is an effort to try and build our youth program by giving middle schoolers, like the high schoolers, an opportunity to go on a weeklong retreat. My hope and prayer is that, like John the Baptist, the retreat directors help lead the kids to experience Jesus Christ, the Light of the world.

Please pray for them.

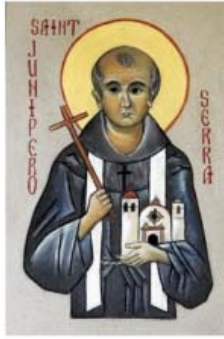


Matthias Grünewald, Isenheim Altarpiece, c. 1515.
