Ascension

The Ascension is traditionally called Ascension Thursday because it takes place 40 days after Easter, which is always a Thursday. The reason that we celebrate the Ascension on Sunday is because the bishops realize that, in our current culture, most people would not go to church on Thursday. As a result, they would miss out on this great feast in our Church and not learn about the importance of Jesus' ascension into heaven.

It's interesting to point out that it was also on a Thursday that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with His disciples. What does this tell us? Jesus told His apostles that He would be with them until the end of time. Jesus' ascension into heaven allows Him to be with His disciples whenever and wherever the Mass is celebrated.

The Ascension is integral to God's plan of salvation. Not only did Jesus rise from the dead, He took our human nature into heaven and forever united it with Himself. When we receive the Eucharist we are united to this same Body that ascended into Heaven. We also have the promise that whoever eats this bread will be raised up with him on the last day.

Happy Mother's Day

The first person to experience being "raised up" was Mary, the Mother of Jesus. At the end of her life she was assumed, body and soul into heaven. It's interesting to point out that not long after Jesus ascended the first person He brought into heaven was His mother. He wanted to be with His mother. Jesus loved His mother in this life and even into eternal life.

Mother's have a special place in the hearts of their children. On Mother's Day, as we reflect on the gift that our mother is to us and take the opportunity to thank her, let us also reflect on how their choice for life, and their nurturing in the faith, has given us the opportunity to receive the gift of eternal life. Hopefully, on the last day, when we are raised up, we can thank God for all eternity in heaven.

Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord



“The Ascension of our Lord and Saviour is an event ever to be commemorated with joy and thanksgiving, for St. Paul tells us in the text that He ascended to the right hand of God, and there makes intercession for us. Hence it is our comfort to know, that “if any man sin, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous, and He is the propitiation for our sins.” [1 John ii. 1, 2.] As the Jewish High Priest, after the solemn sacrifice for the people on the great day of Atonement, went into the Holy of Holies with the blood of the victim, and sprinkled it upon the Mercy-Seat, so Christ has entered into Heaven itself, to present (as it were) before the Throne that sacred Tabernacle which was the instrument of His passion,—His pierced hands and wounded side,—in token of the atonement which He has effected for the sins of the world.”
