From the Pastor's Desk

On Saturday, May 26, four deacons from our Archdiocese will be ordained at the Cathedral in St. Paul. Among these deacons are Toulee Peter Ly and Colin Jones. As you know, Deacon Peter has been our teaching parish seminarian and Deacon Colin grew up in this parish. His family moved to Oak Grove when he was in the seminary. They attend St. Patrick's, but he still considers St. Charles his home parish. It was in this parish that his vocation to the priesthood was nurtured. I have asked these men to offer some words of gratitude to you:



Whenever people ask me, "How did you know you wanted to be a priest?" there are two themes which immediately come to mind, and which I usually tell them right off the bat. Firstly, I talk about my wonderful family, and explain how my parents, grandparents, and extended relatives all contributed in manifold ways to my

Of course, your support for me here at St. Charles has remained with me even throughout those years of seminary, and I can humbly say that the Lord certainly answered your prayers by showing me the way through that long journey. Now, as a priest, I hope that I can be a minister of God's love

and a witness to the joy of the Catholic Church, and so give to my people from the many gifts which you have given to me!

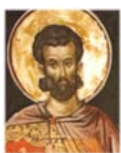
